Selected to the Senior Executive Service in May 2005, Mr. Uldric L. Fiore, Jr. (“Ric”) assumed duties as Director, Soldier and Family Legal Services in July 2008. Mr. Fiore is responsible for policy and oversight of legal services provided to soldiers and their families, including legal assistance and claims services, with particular emphasis on legal support to Army Wounded Warriors in the Medical Evaluation and Physical Disability Evaluation processes.

From May 2005 to July 2008, Mr. Fiore served as General Counsel for the Department of Defense Office of Inspector General, with responsibility for ensuring independent counsel and legal advice to the Inspector General and to the Office of Inspector General senior managers across the range of Inspector General missions and functions, including criminal and administrative investigations, audits, inspections, and reviews.
